
#### Are we there yet?

### 2,755 Stories Shared!

This year, we supported World Book Day by taking part in their 'Share a Million Stories Campaign' championing the importance of sharing stories. We set ourselves the challenge of sharing 5000 stories in 5 weeks. Unfortunately we did not get to the end of the 5 week challenge due to lockdown but in the first 2 weeks we had already shared more than 2,750 stories!



### St Peter's Ironman Challenge

For Sports Relief this year we challenged the children to complete a 'St Peter's Ironman' - that is 3.86 km (2.4 miles) swimming, 180.25 km (112 miles) cycling and 42.2 km (26.22 miles) running.

Throughout the week of the 9th March, children were encouraged to swim, run and cycle to contribute to the total number of kilometres needed to achieve our target.

Pegasus Class achieved our swimming target of 3.86 kilometres during their school swimming lesson on Wednesday morning.



The whole school ran around the MUGA at lunchtimes and during PE lessons achieving a distance in excess of 42.2 kilometres.

Thank you to Ava and Clark's dad for providing two spin bikes. The children pedalled hard to reach the goal of 180.25 kilometres!

On Friday children arrived in school representing over fifteen different sports! Ice hockey, snow mobiling, zumba, ballet, karate, jui jitsu, table tennis, swimming, boxing, gymnastics, cricket, golf, cycling, running, dance, and of course rugby and football.
